

UNITED STATES SENATE
VOTING RECORD – 112TH CONGRESS, FIRST SESSION (2011)

Vote 1 - HR 1: Fiscal 2011 Continuing Appropriations - Passage

Mar 9: Passage of the bill that would provide continuing appropriations through fiscal 2011 for all government agencies, making deep and severe cuts to the IRS, FDA and Social Security Administration while also underfunding the Department of Homeland Security. It also would nullify important consumer protection provisions in the health care reform law.

Rejected 44-56

NTEU Position: NO

Vote 2 - HR 2560: Spending Cap and Conditional Debt-Limit Increase - Motion to Table

Jul 22: Reid (D-NV), motion to kill the motion to proceed to the bill that would make an increase in the debt limit contingent upon the passage of a balanced-budget constitutional amendment even if it resulted in RIFs and furloughs. The bill also made immediate budget cuts to NTEU represented agencies that could have the same effect.

Adopted 51-46

NTEU Position: YES

Vote 3 - HR 2112: Fiscal 2012 Agriculture, Commerce-Justice-Science, Transportation-HUD Appropriations - Passage

Nov 1: Passage of the bill that would provide about \$127.8 billion in discretionary funds for USDA, FDA, PTO and other agencies for fiscal 2012, thereby preventing a shutdown at those agencies. The bill included an NTEU supported funding increase for FDA and allowed PTO to keep all of its fee revenue.

Passed 69-30

NTEU Position: YES

Vote 4 - S 1931: Federal Employee Wage Freeze - Motion to Proceed

Dec 1: McConnell (R-KY) motion to proceed to the bill that would extend current payroll tax rates for individuals through 2012 by paying for it by extending the pay freeze for federal workers for three years and reduce the federal civilian work force through attrition.

Rejected 20-78

NTEU Position: NO

Vote 5 - S J Res 10: Balanced-Budget Amendment - Passage

Dec 14: Passage of the joint resolution that would propose a constitutional amendment that would require a balanced budget starting in the fifth fiscal year after ratification by three-fourths of the states. This would likely result in RIFs and furloughs with no opportunity for congressional action to stop or mitigate them. The proposal would require that total outlays do not exceed 18 percent of the gross domestic product. Under the proposal, three-fifths of the entire House and Senate would be required to approve an increase in the public debt limit. In addition, tax increases would require the affirmative vote of two-thirds in both chambers.

Rejected 47-53

NTEU Position: NO

Vote 6 - H Con Res 94, Discretionary Funding Rescission – Adoption

Dec 17: Adoption of concurrent resolution that would direct the House Clerk to add rescission language to the Disaster Relief bill (HR 3672) that would make an across the board cut to FY12 funding for NTEU represented agencies and others by 1.83%.

Rejected 43-56
